

Civil War files and claims for financial losses filed by citizens of Madison County

“Rebel Account. Claim of _____ vs. The United States for “Quartermaster Stores” or “Commissary Supplies” or “Damages”

Four-page brochure lists the **claimant** and **age**, the local **committee members** who attest to knowing the claimant, **date of claims**, **the articles taken** by the military (livestock, crops, bushels of corn, flour, pounds of beef, etc), their **value** at the time of seizure (per unit and total value) being used by the Federal troops or the REBEL ARMY, **by whose order** or authority items were taken and when, CERTIFICATE OF CIVIL OR MILITARY OFFICER OF THE UNITED STATES, CLERK’S CERTIFICATE, and decision of committee (approved or denied), with signatures of General Claim Commissioner and the Governor of the State of Tennessee. Most of the claims are dated in May and June 1868.
